Healing: Mind, Body and Soul

During Jesus' earthly ministry he performed many acts of healing. He cured the blind, opened the ears of the deaf, gave mobility to the lame and even brought the dead back to life. Many times he used the terminology "your faith has cured you" or he would instruct them to renounce sin, and to believe in and follow him. This is a healing of the whole person; mind, body and soul that leads us to the Father.

God has also given us a pathway to healing through the Saints:

Saint Raphael the Archangel ~ Patron Saint of Healing Unlike most saints, Raphael was never a human being. He has always been a heavenly angel given the mission to heal the mind, body, and spirit. This is his role in the Heavenly Court and before the throne of God. We can have recourse to this powerful archangel in our own brokenness, illness, and suffering.

Raphael is depicted the in Old Testament in the Book of Tobit in which there are two characters in need of healing. Tobit a devout and wealthy Israelite who suffers severe losses and is finally blinded. Because of his misfortunes he begs the Lord to let him die. The second character, a young woman, Sarah, in the town of Media, also prays for death, because she has lost seven husbands, each killed in turn on his wedding night by the demon Asmodeus. God hears the prayers of Tobit and Sarah and sends the angel Raphael in human form to aid them both.

Tobit remembers a large sum of money that he had deposited in the town of Media and asks his son, Tobiah to travel to Media and collect his money. Disguised as a guide, Raphael accompanies Tobiah to Media. During the journey, Tobiah is attacked by a large fish as he bathes in the Tigris River. Raphael orders him to seize it and to remove its gall, heart, and liver because they are useful for medicine. Raphael urges Tobiah to marry Sarah, and to use the fish's heart and liver to drive Asmodeus from the bridal chamber. Upon his return to Nineveh with his wife and his father's money, Tobiah rubs the fish's gall into his father's eyes and cures him. Raphael reveals his true identity and returns to heaven. Tobit then utters his beautiful hymn of praise. This is a perfect example of how lives were healed.
